Student Welfare Accountability Report

The Division is committed to providing a safe and healthy study and work environment for its students, staff members, volunteers, and the general public. The welfare (safety and well-being) of the students in our schools is of vital importance to the parents, staff, and Board of Education of the school division. This report summarizes information related to Student Welfare for the 2025-26 school year.

Superintendent of Education Steven Boucher highlighted that a common theme across all areas reported is the importance of community partnerships. For example, the Community Threat Assessment and Support Protocol involves a variety of community partnerships from across the region who have committed to collaborate, share relevant information, and develop supportive and preventative plans to enhance safety in our schools and communities.

Feedback from the Spring 2026 collection of student perception data from the *OurSchool* surveys, completed by students from grades 4-12, was presented. Student perception data on a variety of topics is collected annually, and reports on themes such as career pathways and bullying & school safety are developed. Individual schools receive similar reports based on their student responses and develop action plans to enhance and support the student experience.

2025-26 Year-End Transportation Report

CTTCS CFO Delmar Zwirsky provided a Transportation Update to capture the year end 2025-26 information regarding urban bus service. CTTCS contracts urban bus services for approximately 525 students within the City of Melville and City of Yorkton. The report provided the Board with background information, as well as updates on the four key risk areas of Driver Competence, Student Behaviour, Vehicle Maintenance/Condition, and External Factors.

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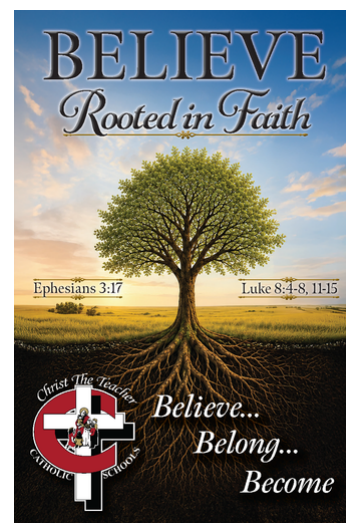
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
